

Percentage of Highly Qualified Teachers

On October 19, 2006 all school districts in the State of Texas received a notice from the Texas Education Agency informing them of the requirement to publicly report their annual progress toward meeting the State's targets for highly qualified teachers. The chart below gives the progress of Schertz-Cibolo Universal City Independent School District and each individual school towards meeting the State targets. If a district or campus fails to meet the targets for two consecutive years, TEA will provide technical assistance in the development of an improvement plan that will enable the district or campus to meet the targets.
