FINANCIAL AID INFORMATION—Seniors 2008 may submit the 2009-2010 FAFSA NO EARLIER than Jan 1, 2008.

At that time, in order to apply for Financial Aid, seniors need to go to the 2009-2010 FAFSA (Free Application for Federal Student Aid) website at: www.fafsa.ed.gov . Students must complete and submit the FAFSA in order to apply for federal student aid and to apply for most state and college financial aid. Applying online with *FAFSA on the Web* is faster and easier than using a paper

FAFSA. Worksheets for *FAFSA on the Web* are available in the Counseling Office. Should a student not be able to apply online, paper copies of the FAFSA are also available in the Counseling Office.

Very Important:

Both **Texas A & M University-College Station** and the **University of Texas at Austin** have announced a change in application deadline dates for admission for Fall 2009. The new admissions application deadline date for both schools is January 15, 2009. **THIS is an earlier application deadline than before.**

News Flash!!

Vanderbilt University (Nashville, TN) announces exciting news regarding need-based financial aid. Vanderbilt is making three important commitments to undergraduate students who are U.S. citizens or non-citizens who apply and are eligible for federal need-based aid: 1. They will be “need-blind” in the admissions process; 2. They will meet 100% of demonstrated financial need for all admitted as well as returning undergraduate students; and 3. Beginning in the fall of 2009, need-based financial aid packages offered to entering undergraduate students will not include need-based loans—instead grant/gift assistance that does not have to be repaid as well as a work component will be offered to students.

Harvard College (the undergraduate college at Harvard University) has eliminated its early admissions program and has adopted a single application deadline of January 1. They believe that this will prove to be simpler and fairer. Harvard’s new financial aid policies ensure that families with incomes below \$60,000 *are not asked to contribute to the cost of sending their children to Harvard*. The new policy also reduces the amount that families with incomes below \$180,000 will be expected to pay. For more information, go to www.admissions.college.harvard.edu.

The University of Texas at Arlington has announced their Maverick Promise program making higher education more affordable by granting free tuition to students whose household income is \$65,000 or less. When submitting college applications, you will need an official transcript. The first transcript is free; all others are **\$1 each**. If the transcript is for a scholarship, and the scholarship name and address are listed on the request form, then the transcript is free. Paperwork for the request can be picked up in the counseling office. The turnaround time is **48 hours**. Just a reminder, you will need a parent signature on the first request.

(Please note that Texas State University and Texas Women's University typically do not permit Freshmen or Sophomore students to live off campus. The University of North Texas restricts Freshmen from living off-campus as well. Therefore, scholarships may be limited to upper-classmen at these universities.)
