### **ADDITIONAL INFORMATION - The following are "Non-Bond" items:**

- ⇒ REZONE INTERMEDIATES: In order to maximize district resources, rezoning of current three intermediate campuses will allow for time before new intermediate is needed.
- ⇒ SIPPEL ENROLLMENT CAP: Sippel is designed for 750 students. December 2012 enrollment was 960 students. ES 8 will not be ready to relieve Sippel until (projected) 2015-2016 school year. Projected 2013 enrollment for Sippel is 1,031. Projected 2014 enrollment for Sippel is 1,095.
