❖ MEAL CHARGE PROCEDURE/ADMINISTRATIVE REGULATION

All Grades: A student may charge a total of 3 school days on their meal account. When meal charges are exceeded at lunch, a Deli meal that meets the Federal meal pattern will be served at the price of the student's eligibility. This meal choice is available to all students on a regular meal service line.
