	Alamo Colleges-Dual Credit	UT On-Ramps- Dual Enrollment
Explanation	Participating students will take courses that cover all high school TEKS as well as student learning objectives for the accompanying college course as required by Alamo Colleges. Academic credits are linked to a Texas college common course number should transfer to most Texas public colleges and universities.	Participating students will have Dual Enrollment at both UT Austin and SCUCISD. On-Ramps curriculum is provided by the University of Texas at Austin and aligned closely to state academic standards. If a student's university average for the year is sufficient, they will receive college credit as reflected on a UT transcript at student's discretion which should transfer to most Texas public colleges and universities.
Credit Awarded	High school graduation credit awarded if the student has a passing grade aligned to district expectations. College credit is awarded based on the student's performance in the course per Alamo Colleges grading guidelines with which there is a Memorandum of Understanding (MOU). Students obtain one grade reflected at both the high school and St. Phillips.	High school credit is awarded for successfully completing the course. A student will earn two different grades, one through the university and one through the high school that may be different. Student is awarded college credit by meeting criteria set by UT Austin.
Eligibility	Students must qualify for admission to the college or university and register by the deadline. Students must meet pre-requisites for the course as well as show college readiness through ACT, SAT or TSI.	Open Enrollment- no TSI needed for eligibility. Students can enroll with classroom teacher at the beginning of the school year. College readiness is determined by student performance at the university throughout the academic year
