


COME READ WITH US!

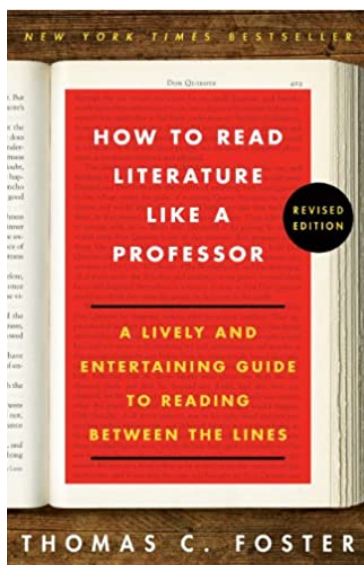
INCOMING IB ENGLISH III & IB ENGLISH IV AT CLEMENS HIGH SCHOOL

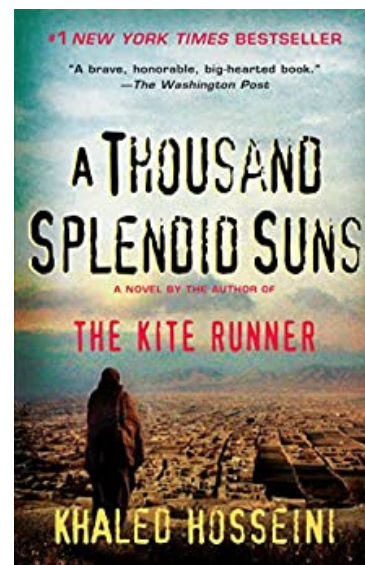

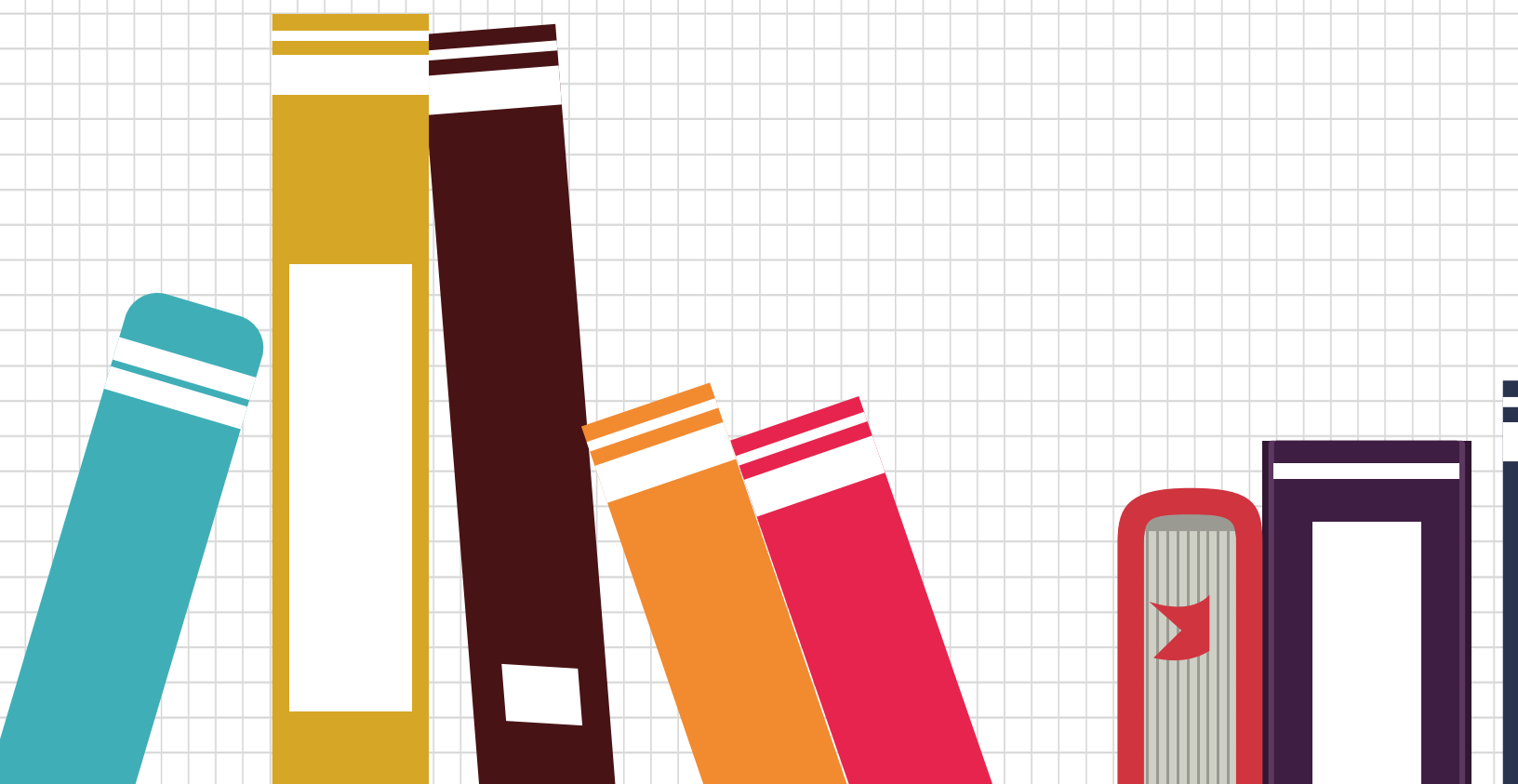

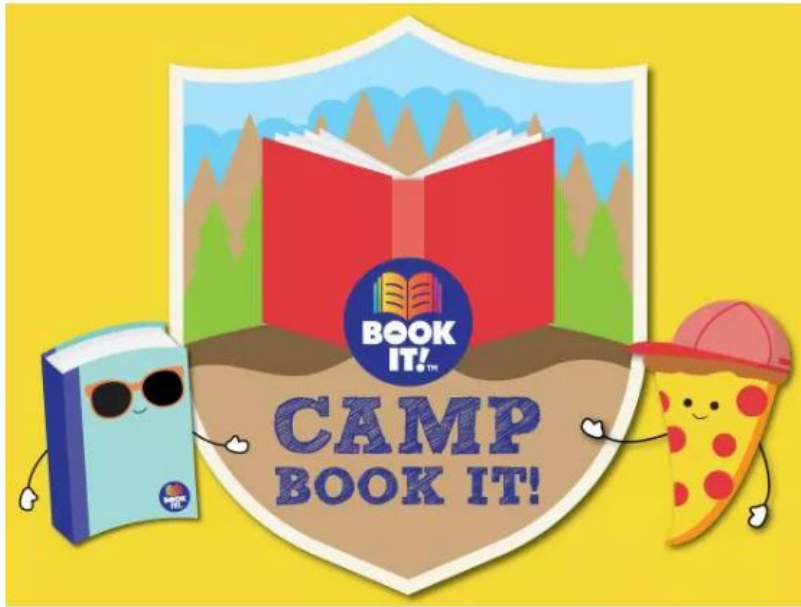
