The School Based Health Center (SBHC) is a mission of the Methodist Healthcare Ministries of South Texas, Inc. (MHM)—the largest, faith-based, not-for-profit funding source for community healthcare services to low-income families and the uninsured in South Texas.

The SBHC provides pediatric primary healthcare and dental services in clinics operated by MHM. A comprehensive range of services is offered to children enrolled in the Marion and Schertz-Cibolo-Universal City Independent School Districts, as well as their brothers and sisters up to age 21.

Affordability

Charges for medical and dental services vary according to procedure; however, all services are provided on a sliding fee scale. Services will be provided regardless of your ability to pay.

Additional services include an annual dental prevention program which includes a limited dental exam, two fluoride varnish applications and dental sealants for students in specific grades who need them. This program is provided in partnership with the University of Texas Health Science Center San Antonio and available at no cost for students who qualify. Please call the SBHC at (210) 658-4875 for more information about the dental prevention program.

Counseling and social services are also available at no cost.

How to enroll your child

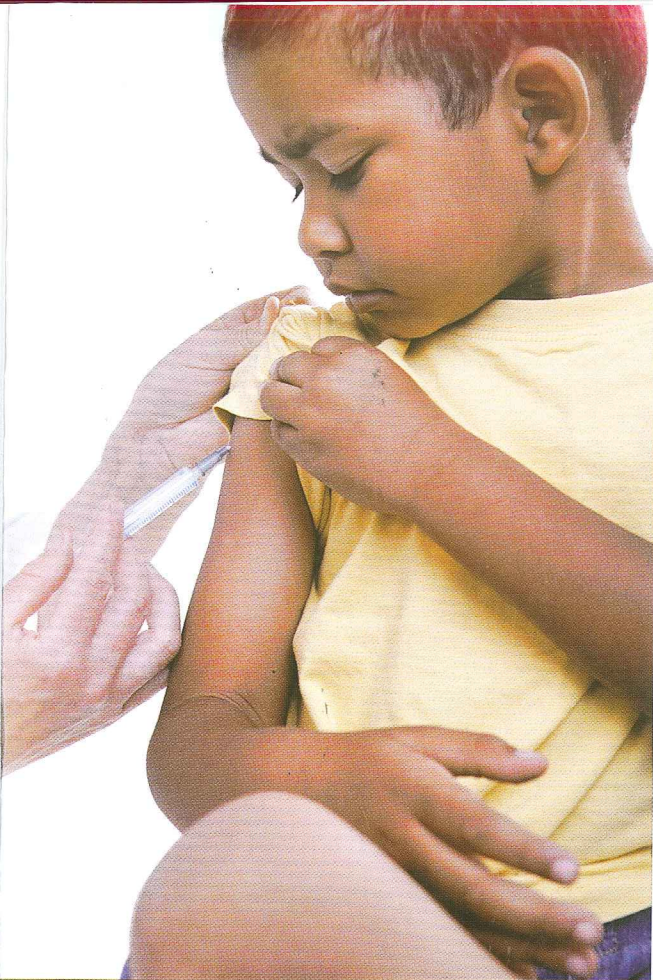
If you wish to enroll your child for the current school year complete and submit the enclosed forms to the SBHC. Forms can be mailed or delivered in person to:

With the proper consent forms on file, we can offer you the convenience of treating your child without the necessity of your presence, reducing the number of absences your student accumulates and avoiding time off from your work for you. The SBHC does require a note or phone call from a parent or legal guardian providing their express authorization to allow the SBHC staff to take your student out of class for treatment. All information provided to the SBHC about your child will be kept confidential.

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Medical & Dental Services

Diagnosis and treatment of simple illness or minor injury.
Immunizations.

Physical exams for school sports, cheerleading, dance team, Boy Scouts and camp.

Well child exams.

Health promotion and education.

Prescription assistance.

Referral to primary care providers, specialists and resources within the community.

Primary dental care including examinations, x-rays, cleanings, fluoride treatments and sealants.

Dental treatment including fillings, extractions and endodontic treatment available.

Referral to other dental specialists as necessary.

Social Services

Individual and family counseling available as well as case management services.

Information and referral to community resources.

Assistance with Medicaid and CHIP applications.

Patients may be referred to social services by SBHC staff based on the patient's needs and/or clinic visit.

SBHC Team

The SBHC health care team includes a pediatric nurse practitioner, registered nurse, board certified family physician, dentist, dental hygienist, dental assistant, social workers and administrative staff.
