## **Registration**

After Registration, you will check-in at the front desk of your assigned hotel and pick up the room keys for you and your students. No changes may be made to room assignments. If you have a bus driver room, please be sure to pick up the key at their assigned hotel. The room will be under your school name and "Bus Driver."

## **Dress**

FCCLA's new dress code was implemented in the 2012-13 school year. Those attending will need to be in official dress for the meeting: red, white or black collared shirt with black or khaki pants/skirt. (See website for entire listing of the dress code) Region and state officers will be in uniform. We appreciate your help in making sure the students are in required attire. We suggest your students travel in official dress and be ready to participate in the meeting upon arrival.

## **Parking**

Self-parking at the hotels and convention center is complimentary. Buses can park on the side away from the river at the Courtyard. At the Hilton, there is plenty of space for bus parking in the lot.

## **Meals**

For meals that are on your own, there are a number of restaurant options within 5 miles of the hotel. The Hilton hotel will also be offering cash sales on Sunday for breakfast. Lunch on Sunday will be provided for all delegates. This will be a working lunch and a time for advisors to work with their students on their plans when they return to school.

## **Cancellations**

As stated in the meeting release, there is a \$150 per person charge for each cancellation of attendee. We know that you understand why this is necessary; the association is paying room costs and have paid for speakers and training materials. If you arrive with a smaller number of participants than were originally registered, be prepared to pay this amount.
