


Records Request/Consent for Release

In accordance with Texas Education Code (TEC) 28.0256, each student must do one of the following in order to graduate:

- Complete and submit a Free Application for Federal Student AID (FAFSA)
- Complete and submit a Texas
   Application for State Financial Aid TAFSA) or;
- Submit a signed opt-out form

### How to create your FSA ID

This is will take about 10 minutes to complete and must be completed before you can fill in the FAFSA.

- 1. Visit Studentaid.gov
- 2. Type in personal information, create a username and password, and set up your security challenge questions.
- 3. Provide either email address or mobile number to make future login attempts easier.

### Accuplacer Student Portal - Access your TSI Score Report

### **Helpful hints:**

### When testing:

- When you test, ask for a printout of your Score Report.
- If possible, have your proctor email you a copy of the Score Report.
- Take a picture of your Score Report before you leave the testing site.

### After testing:

- Use this QR code to have the Score Report sent to you.
- If you have tested for DC purposes, we use your Banner ID. Use that number as your "Student ID."
- When you request your Score Report through Accuplacer Student Portal, check your email before the email expires (10 days).



### How to send SAT scores:

- 1. Sign in to your College Board account, then go to the Send SAT Scores page.

  On the Send SAT Scores page, you might get a prompt about fee waivers. If
  the message does not apply to you, you can ignore it.
- 1. Select institutions to send your scores and information to.
  - 1. Search for institutions by name or code.
  - 2. Click one or more institutions to add them to the score recipients list, then click Continue.
- 2. For each recipient, send all scores or only some of your scores.

  If you've taken the SAT more than once, you can send only your best score.

  However, the institution you're sending scores to might have a policy that they want to see all of your scores. As you select scores to send, you can view the policy requirements of the schools you selected and send what they require.
- 1. Review your order. Check out.



### How to Request Your Transcript Through ACES

Both current and former students can request transcripts online via ACES.

• **Current students** can access web services at the top left corner of their 'Student' page.

Web Services > Student tab > Student Records > Request Official Transcript

• Former students can access web services at the bottom left side of their 'Home' page.

Web Services > Student tab > Student Records > Request Official Transcript



### How to request a transcript from UT OnRamps:



- 1. First, make sure your grades are on your grade report
- 2. Order your official transcript online within three years of your course completion date.
